"Don't be afraid of the space between your dreams and reality.

When Chris Hadfield was a little boy, (0)_E_. He was only nine years old when he watched the Apollo 11 Moon landing on TV. He was mesmerised. The gap between a scrawny kid growing up on a farm, and a superhero that he imagined an astronaut to be, seemed unbridgeable. At that time, Canada had no astronaut program whatsoever, but Chris would not be deterred.

As a teenager, he spent a lot of time fixing old cars and tractors and flying old planes with his father and brothers above vast corn fields of his native Ontario. Later, he graduated from the Royal Military College with a degree in mechanical engineering. He worked his way up from a glider pilot in the Royal Canadian Air Cadets to a tactical fighter pilot of the Royal Canadian Air Force. As a test pilot, (1) ______, including several experimental planes. He always did his best, making sure that, when the opportunity arose, he would be there and ready to grab it.

He did not have to wait very long. In 1992, he was selected by the newly established Canadian Space Agency to become one of the first four Canadian astronauts. His first space flight was in 1995, when he became the only Canadian ever to board the Russian Space Station *Mir*. During his second space flight, in 2001, (2) _____ and became the first Canadian to leave a spacecraft and float freely in space. During his third, and final, space flight, Chris Hadfield became the first Canadian to command the International Space Station.

Thanks to his social media savvy, (3) _____, not only in Canada, but all over the world. He documented his everyday life aboard the International Space Station and posted on social media. He shared breathtaking photos of the Blue Planet as well as various space phenomena. He Skyped with schools and encouraged students to ask questions about life in space. He then filmed videos as answers to these questions and posted them on YouTube. So, if you have ever wondered how astronauts sleep, brush their teeth or wash their hands in space, why they don't eat bread in space, or if it is possible to wring out water from a towel in space, check out Canadian Space Agency YouTube channel for hours and hours of fun.

This incredibly down-to-earth spaceman also proved to be a talented musician. On December 24, 2012, he uploaded *Jewel in the Night* on YouTube, the first song ever to be recorded in outer space. Later, (4) ______, including a rendition of David Bowie's *Space Oddity*. Before returning home, he even released a music video for the cover of this iconic song to mark his departure from his final space mission. It was the first music video made in space; a truly memorable performance that, as of February 2021, has almost 49 million views on YouTube.

Even now that he has retired from active duty, as a motivational speaker, (5) _____. He wants to show them that, by doing what you love, you can make the impossible a reality.

In the sea of questionable role models, this incredible man with a remarkable career stands out as a beacon to inspire every little kid with a dream to reach for the stars and never give up. In Chris's own words: "Every decision you make, from what you eat to what you do with your time tonight, turns you into who you are tomorrow, and the day after that."

Black History Month is celebrated every year in the United States and Canada
